Through Pinkathon the students were encouraged to adopt health and fitness in their daily lifestyles by means of running.



## **Creating Milestones in Sports**

At the District level sport competition 'Khel Mahakumbh' held at YMD College, Nuh, students and coaches from all our 18 government schools under Sunrise Sports (YONEX) 'Sports for Development' program - Badminton participated in this mega event in Under-14, Under-17 and open (coaches) category. The champions were rewarded with medals by Rahul Narwal, IAS along with DSO of Nuh while back in their schools they were given the warmest of welcome and the Sarpanch even announced to give Rs. 21,000/- to the winner team and sport attire for each player.



## **Sports Promotion – Badminton**

In July, a three day District Level Badminton Championship was given a head start in Nuh, Mewat by the Mewat District Badminton Association. Dr. Manoj Kumar, SDM, Nuh was the chief guest and Dr. Suresh Reddy, Director SRF Foundation was the Guest of Honour of the event. 61 students from Sport for Development - Badminton program schools, supported by Sunrise Sports (YONEX), participated in this championship out of which 11 won various positions in different categories. Our coaches too participated and three secured first position in senior category.



# **Transforming Education Not by Chance but by Design**

To develop critical thinking and solution oriented attitude among children through Feel, Imagine, Do and Share philosophy, two representatives from Design For Change (DFC) organised a workshop in August with 48 teachers and 104 students from Mewat, Bhiwadi, Bangalore and Chennai. This gave children a platform to express their idea for a better world and put them into action. After the workshop DFC facilitators also distributed tool kits, banners and CD to all the participating schools to help them put their learning into practice.

The members of the village community also took the benefit of this camp and the Sarpanch and gram panchayat team extended their full support for this event.

Also all the 20 students of the July batch were placed with TVS-Logistics with a monthly income of 10k.


### **Promoting Green Initiatives**
