Learning through Sports- "Khel Khel Mein" Sports Meet & PEC India

On 12 February 2011, we sent a team of students to participate in an inter-NGO Sports Meet. This event was jointly organised by SRF Foundation, Concern India Foundation and the Atheletics of India (AFI) to provide students with a platform to develop their self-esteem through sports. The training efforts of our TSRS PTIs paid off with our students bagging not only 12 event medals, but also the "Best Athlete" award and the "Best Organisation" award.

We also conducted a Physical Eduction training program known as PEC India, for 18 KidSmart Vidya Volunteers and 9 Bridge School Facilitators. The program aimed to equip teachers with essential skills to use PEC cards and equipment in their schools. During the two-day programme, teachers were taught how to deliver fun, safe and inclusive PE sessions.

Learning through Technology- IBM KidSmart Programme

After much renovation and construction, we officially launched our IBM KidSmart Programme in 18 schools. Each center now serves the educational needs of 400 students of age 3-8 years old. To aid the running of our centers, we also hired villagers and organized training workshops in the areas of IT skills, physical education, art and craft and language skills to prepare them for their facilitator roles.
